On the back of this sheet is a list of camp rules that all campers are expected to follow.

Mt. Zion Camp Rules/Policies

Mt. Zion Camp is a Christian camp. The following rules are in place to provide an environment where God is honored and where we can get away from the world and its pressure on our lives.

- Campers are directed not to bring or use cell phones, game systems, or other electronic devices. The use of digital cameras is allowed. If a camper is found using any electronic device, it will be confiscated until the final flag lowering, at which time the item will be returned to the camper.
- Campers do not need to bring any money with them to camp. All food, activities, and extra essentials are taken care of by Mt. Zion.
- Campers are asked to keep underwear and proper body parts covered with appropriate clothing. Appropriate clothing includes t-shirts, shorts, tank tops, jeans, and capris. Inappropriate clothing includes low cut shirts, spaghetti straps, short shorts, leggings, muscle shirts, crop tops, and t-shirts with inappropriate words/pictures. Short shorts are defined as being shorter than the second knuckle when standing. A camper wearing clothing deemed inappropriate by the camp director will be asked to change. If the camper does not have appropriate clothing of their own, appropriate clothing will be provided.
- Campers are asked to refrain from PDA (public displays of affection) among each other. This includes holding hands, kissing, etc.
- Campers are asked to stay the full length of camp. Arrangements to leave made **PRIOR to arriving at camp** with the director are accepted, as well as emergencies at the discretion of the director. In those cases the director should be notified personally by the camper's parent or guardian.
- Items left at the camp will be kept for 2 WEEKS. After that time items will be sent to charity.
- Campers will be notified as to where they are allowed or not allowed to go during camp.
- Campers are expected to respect the leaders, fellow campers, and camp property.
- Campers are asked to not bring inappropriate reading materials, illegal drugs, alcohol, and fireworks. If the situation involves an illegal offense, the proper authorities (Sheriff or Division of Family Services) will be contacted.

Campers who break the rules will be sent home at the discretion of the camp director.

IMPORTANT!

In recent years we have had an increase in visitors. This has become a safety issue and a distraction to our camp staff and more importantly the campers. We are asking that family and friends refrain from coming to the campgrounds while camp is in session. We also **do not** allow parents/guardians to bring food or drink items to campers unless it has been approved by the director. If you need to get something to your camper you can check it in to the kitchen, and we will make sure it is delivered to your child.
